Greetings to all our readers and friends. Casting my mind back over the past year we can claim to have been most active.

A trip to Brunoy in April, to celebrate 25 years of Twinning, was especially memorable. This was followed by a most enjoyable visit to Eschweiler in July. The most important elements of these exchanges is the continual friendships maintained across the Channel. Without Twinning we would be much poorer. I personally find a great joy in seeing - now old friends - on these journeys.

I, with Monique and Ted Pottage, had the honour to be invited to Brunoy by their Mayor to join their commemorations to mark the end of the Great War. The mayor of their German twin town, Wittlich was also present, as were two delegates representing their Portuguese twinning. Gathering round the town's War Memorial, exactly 100 years after the Armistice, was a poignant moment for all those attending. It is a very sobering thought that more French soldiers died during the First World War than British. I lost two great uncles, aged twenty one and nineteen while other family members survived. I suspect that most of us twinning will have similar stories, too.

On a lighter note it poured with rain during our ceremony. I understand it did too at the Cenotaph. We share similar weather!

## Eschweiler Link

At this time of year we think especially about the end of the Great War and those who gave us our freedom. As we recently spent a holiday with our German friends in Spain, we reflected how lucky we are now in Europe to be able to live together in peace and friendship.

In Germany their remembrance day is the following week, but on 11 November the Eschweiler Karneval season begins when the Prinz for the forthcoming year is announced. This year it will be Prinz Paulo with his brother Pedro as his Ceremony Master - their family actually comes originally from Portugal, but have lived so many years in Eschweiler that they are now a real part of it!

In September we received a surprise invitation from the Mayor of Watrelos and their Carnival group to attend the 40th anniversary celebrations with Eschweiler at their annual Berlouffes festival. Berlouffes dolls are thrown from the church in the main square to commemorate a local historical event, with a bonfire afterwards. In conjunction with this and also traditionally, on that day cars are banned and the entire town of Watrelos becomes a kind of giant car boot sale as residents take over the pavements outside their houses to sell whatever they want to get rid of from their attics. It was the first time we had been and we had a great time, thanks to the members of the Confrerie du Carnaval (who also act as the Twinning Association with Eschweiler).

### ❖ Twinning. Quiz - 8 February

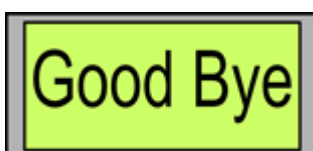
