Visit to Brunoy – 10-12 April

After an uneventful run, we were welcomed by our French friends and taken to the Town Hall for the formal welcome. An early start the following day enabled the party to arrive at Reims in good time for a visit to the Pommery champagne cellar. A daunting 116 steps down (and back up again later!) with no option of a lift. This was a combination of conical chalk pits, some going back to Roman times, joined together by lengthy tunnels. In addition to the racks of bottles, Pommery had on display sculptures and more modern creations plus projected images which enhanced the experience. The breathless return to ground level was rewarded with a "taste of the product" which led to many purchases in the gift shop on the way out.

The next stop was the old cathedral in which the original king of France was crowned almost 1,000 years ago. Then on to the "new" cathedral, following a brief break for lunch. Noticeable were the shell splinter marks in the North side stones – the First World War was very close here. The city is relatively new, but a drive down the Ave de Champagne in Epernay

revealed the magnificent buildings containing the champagne houses which are household names. In Reims, M. Moussy had joined our party and had become an excellent tour guide. He then guided the coach to his house where his wife and family provided an excellent meal – washed down with his champagne of course! Our driver had to press us to leave as his driving hours were running short, but not before the luggage area was filled with a good supply of our host's creation, especially the 2010 vintage! We made it back to Brunoy in time – just.

Most hosts and guests enjoyed informal walks in the locality and buffet lunch before the traditional group photo and departure for Calais. A trouble free run saw us in the port in time for the earlier boat, but this appeared to be very full. Our driver kept us on the coach as we waited and we were able to get the last place while other drivers were trying to round up their passengers – a good tip for the future.

Charlemagne Award of Aachen (Karlspreiz zu Aachen)

The International Charlemagne Prize of Aachen is the oldest and best known prize awarded for work done in the service of European unification. The prize is named for Charlemagne, the Franconian king revered by his contemporaries as the "Father of Europe".

At a ceremony in Aachen last week, Dr. h.c. Martin Schulz, President of the EU, and a resident of Eschweiler, became the 57th winner of the prize as "an outstanding mentor of a united Europe who has earned important and lasting merits for his efforts towards a strengthening of parliament, parliamentarianism, and democratic legitimation in the EU ..".

The ceremony in Aachen was a grand affair, attended by many dignitaries including the Kings of Spain and Belgium, as well as King Abdullah II. There is also a Charlemagne Youth Prize.

The award has previously been won by Winston Churchill, Edward Heath and Roy Jenkins.
